



# Volley & Bayonet

## A 6mm Napoleonic Event - Warclouds 2010

### General:

A Napoleonic event hosted by the Christchurch Wargames Club as part of "[Warclouds over Woolston](#)" on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> of February 2010.

The rules will be "Volley & Bayonet Road to Glory" with official errata if available.

Please note players may attend one or both days. Normal registration applies.

### Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> February:

This is a themed event covering the period 1799-1815. Permitted lists are those defined in the Napoleonic Wars section of the rules. Within this period games will be, where possible, between historic opponents.

Armies are nominally limited to 3000 points. Players are encouraged to provide additional lists for variety. These can be of the same or different nationality and year. This is to assist with ensuring historical matchups are achieved where possible. For example a player using a French army could provide lists for 1806, 1809 and 1815 with little requirement for additional troops.

Other rules or details include:

- 6mm figures based for half scale will be used.
- The ground scale is 1" = 200 yards.
- Tables will provisionally measure 1200mm x 900mm.
- Scenarios will be developed using the "Road to Glory" scenario system.
- Players are encouraged to bring their own terrain.
- Terrain will be pre-set.

### Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> February:

A large multi-player 1813 game is being planned. All armies and terrain will be provided. The battle will likely involve Austrian, Prussian and Russian forces engaged against French and allied forces on a large table. Registration for this multi-player event is essential and player numbers may be restricted.
