


Battle of the Silver Helmets Halen, 12 August 1914

Special Rules

1. The Jäger Battalion must be attached to a cavalry brigade
2. Artillery has a maximum of 10 artillery fire missions
3. German horse artillery batteries can only be used on-table in direct fire mode (this reflects the rapid deployment of the German horse artillery).
4. The River Gette is not fordable. The German cavalry have a maximum of two pontoon bridges. A pontoon bridge will take 4 turns to erect for one engineer stand, or 2 turns for two engineer stands.

Victory Conditions (German)

1. If the Belgian commander chooses to bring on the infantry reinforcements, then the German commander must have at least one cavalry stand left south of the River Gette at the end of the game.

OR

2. If the Belgian commander chooses NOT to bring on the infantry reinforcements, then the German commander must control the highest terrain contour of the ridge south of Halen. No Belgian forces must be present on the ridge.
